19. FOREIGN MILITARY MISSIONS

Danish Nationals are being recruited for the British Army. They are enlisted in the British Army and appointed to the Buffs (E. Kent R.) of which the King of Denmark is Colonel-in-Chief. It is proposed that Danish Nationals will rendezvous at an embarkation point in Canada, and proceed to the United Kingdom under N.D.H.C. arrangements.
