I said, in 1880 and 1881, that whenever an Election came, this policy would be sustained, that after it had been five years on the Statute-book, and after having been perfected from time to time, it would never be repealed in Canada so long as Canada was Canada. Under these circumstances I desire to lay upon the Table of the House the resolution that, when we are in committee, I propose to move in confirmation and perfection of that policy.
