actual count was 61 interred on the field. (See War of 1812-14 page 18.)

Mr. William Gage was a soldier in the British service and took part in the battle. He is a hale and hearty veteran, now in his 83rd year, and resides on the road between Hamilton and Burlington Beach, and is probably the only survivor of the battle in the country.
