WINNIPEG MARKET LETTER

of The First Graders' Grain Company Limited, June 26, 1916)

Wheat. During the week ending June 24th our wheat markets have been steady and generally quite active. In Manitoba there was a sharp recovery from the break of Saturday previous and on Tuesday markets closed higher again. During the latter part of the week American markets were weak and Chicago Jumbo sold below the dollar mark but Winnipeg prices held firm owing to heavy government purchases. The cash wheat prices have also remained about the same, with slightly wider discounts on contract grades. The demand continues steady with apparently enough offerings at all times to satisfy requirements.

The demand continues steady with apparently enough offerings at all times to satisfy requirements. Data—Future prices declined ½ cents for July and advanced ¼ cent for October. There has been a good volume of trading, but heavier receipts will require steady buying to hold the market firm. Cash oats are still at good premiums. Two Canada western oats are receiving ½ cent premium and Three's 1 cent premium.

Barley—Was quiet and higher in price. Offerings are small and readily taken. On the week's business prices show a gain of 1 cent on all grades.

Figs.— See quiet and lower again. July settled a premium of 25 cents over October futures at a premium of 31 cents over July.
