RESOLVED, that this House doth agree with the Committee, in the said resolution.

The order of the day, for the House to resolve into a Committee of the whole House, on the engrossed Bill from the Legislative Council, intituled, "An Act for preventing the forging and counterseiting of foreign bills of exchange, and of foreign promissory notes and orders for the payment of money," being read;

The House accordingly resolved itself into the said Committee.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair.

Mr. Irvine took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair;

And Mr. Irvine reported, that the Committee had come to a resolution, which he was directed to report to the House, whenever it should be pleased to receive the same.

ORDERED, that the report be now received.

And he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered it, with the Bill, in at the Clerk's table, where it was again read.

The resolution contained in the said report, is as solloweth:

Resolved, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that the faid Bill be committed to a Committee of five Members, to report thereon, with all convenient speed, and to have power to send for persons, papers and records.

On motion of Mr. Bourdages, seconded by Mr. Robitaille;

ORDERED, that the question of concurrence be now put on the said refolution.

And
