

The Jitneys.

The jitney, in the picturesque and untrammeled language of certain parts of our country, is a five cent piece. By the simple process of transference it has now come to mean in a growing number of western cities a motorbus that runs regularly over a given route in competition with trolley lines of not, as the case may be, and carries passengers for a five cent fare. The city of its origin is a bit uncertainthough probably the idea came from the European cities, where a similar system has revolutionized urban and uburban transportation-but presumably it was in progressive California, for most of the cities there appear to be well fitted out with flying squadrons of jitneys .- Boston Herald
