WITH THE SOLDIERS

Toronto, May 6.—The two advance parties of the 84th Battalion reached Toronto to-day to prepare the quarters for the coming of the 84th Battalion from Oshawa and Brantford to Toronto. To all questions about the 84th, as to why they had not been chosen to go overseas, or what the trouble was, Brig. Gen. Logie answered as follows: "All matters connected with the 84th are being fully investigated," and not another word would the G.O.C. say on the matter.

There is some interest in military circles in the matter, however, and it is understood that the battalion will soon be in Toronto, and that the inquiry into the internal economy of the unit will be an open one. While it is felt the investigation is absolutely necessary, yet it may not prevent the unit from going overseas very soon. Explanations may be made which will clear some things up. In the meantime the Militia Department will conduct the inquiry.
