## Kentville Honors and Handsomely Supports the Navy

The first effort upon the part of the citizens of Kentville and Kings Co. to contribute to the support of the men of the British Navy and their dependants has been an unqualified success. On Tuesday last the Kentville Branch of the Canadian Navy League held a Tag Day and the handsome sum of \$375.00 was realized.

The day was fine and the Jolly Jack Tar girls in their attractive attire and eager and pretty faces accosted everyone with whom they came in contact. The results show not only how hard they worked, but how eager the people were to contribute towards the comforts of the men of the Navy.

The disappointment on the non appearance of the men from Aldershot was forgotten in the remarkably fine music rendered in the afternoon and evening by Bandmaster Mansley and his associate musicians of the Depot Batt'n Band. Their music alone was a sufficient day's attraction.

The procession marched around the town marshalled by Dr. Moore, accompanied by the Jack Tar horseback taggers, Misses Dorothy Dickey and Maud Publicover. The band was preceded by Master Donald Sealy bearing a large Union Jack. Next came the Kentville Cadets with their band, all receiving many complimentary remarks on their fine appearance. Then followed decorated autos filled with Jack Tars—The Misses Young's Car, and several contributed by Mr. Pelton which added much to the procession.
