We propose to dispense with the position of Lighthouse Inspector as soon as the Government can transfer Mr. Goodison to another position and two sub-inspectors will be appointed—one North and one South—who will reside in their sections and give all their time to inspection, supervising and construction. Two such men are now employed by the Department and are paid out of construction votes. Their appointment would therefore not add to the amount of the general vote.

Last year kero oil cost 40c. per gallon by the cask; in 1918 it cost 40c. per gallon. The wholesale price last year paid by the suppliers of the oil was \$1 1/2 cents, and 34 cents in 1918 less 5 1/2 duty. This therefore shows that the Department paid 8 1/2 cents profit on 1200 cases, 51,600 gals or \$4,378 handed out to a jobber or grafter in one year, and about the same amount in 1918. This matter will be investigated by the Commission of Enquiry now sitting. This year while kero. oil has increased in value 6c. per gallon over last year's rates, would cost the Department 46c. per gallon. We are supplying oil at 28 cents per gallon and reducing the quantity by 20 per cent., as we have cut out wood casks and sent only steel barrels, which will prevent leakage—18 cents per gallon is therefore saved to the Dept. this year on 50,000 gallons, or \$9,000. This amount is still reduced 20 per cent. by lessening the supplies by 10,000 gallons. This is a serious matter, and one that the public and this House should go to the bottom of.

During the year acetylene lights have been erected at Fort Amherst, Mouse Island, Curzon Hd., Bonne Bay, Boxey Point, F.B., Honey Pass Island, B.B., Square Head, B.B.

UNDER ADDITIONAL ESTIMATES

This expenditure of \$121,300.00 is for special work as explained.

In supplemental supply for 1919-20, \$8,000.00 is asked for in each case to cover work and machinery bought and paid for in this year, and the \$4000.00 each asked for as additional estimates for 1920-21 is to cover the cost of completion of this work, so that each year's work may appear in the year that the work and cost of same was done.

GREEN ISLAND, CATALINA

\$12,000.00 for new fog alarm plant.

OIL TANKS

\$3,500.00 to purchase ten 550 gallon kerosene oil tanks to be placed at ten light stations.

11 ACETYLENE LIGHTS

To be erected at the following places:—English Hr. West, West Burgeo, LaPoile, Rencontre, Point Verde, Herring Neck, Harbour Grace, Puffin Island, B.B., and Labrador.

FERRYLAND LIGHT.

Apparatus to greatly improve the existing Light is being imported, consisting of an incandescent oil vapour burner, similar to Cape Spear.

RE-CHARGING STATION.

To refill the cylinders used at the Acetylene Light Stations with acetylene, instead of having to send these cylinders to New Jersey, U.S.A., to

be refilled as we do at present.

3 FOG ALARM OUTFITS.

For Baccalieu—Cape Island or Twillingate, Long Pt., St. Lawrence and Lamaline will have Fog Alarms and Lights completed this season.

Amongst officials included this year but paid from contingencies last year are Hy. Inspector Dunphy at \$900, 2 typists at \$720—\$1440—which if paid as last year would reduce the increase for wages under Head 2 to \$3,243—and this in spite of the additional staff required to carry out the Fish Regulations and the addition to the staff of a Supt. of Fisheries and a Supt. of Marine Works. The latter official has already saved to the country 20 times his salary—and will continue to do so.
