

Panama, Sept. 2.-An important the S. S. Santa Anna cleared yester, treaty, by the terms of which the United States secures control of the waters of the harbors of Colon and Ancon, together with certain other eign relations for Panama. The new convention hac been under consideration for the past four years.

The United States acquires absolute centrol over all the waters of Colon and Ancon harbors, and in addition two small islands lying in Ancon harbor which are to be used for observation and light stations. One of these islands will be fortified. The site of Battery Hancock, on the Colon waterfront, is given to the United States, as also is the control of all piers at the north entrance of the canal, costing approximately \$21-
