**CARDINAL MET WITH ACCIDENT.**  
 Rome, Sept. 2.—The Tribuna says that Cardinal Serapin Vannutelli, the dean of the sacred college, who is almost blind, fell today and injured his leg. The cardinal fainted from the pain but soon revived and was taken to his cell in the conclave. He is 80 years of age. Cardinal Aglardi presided over the ballot this morning.

### VALUABLE RIGHTS SECURED BY U. S.

Panama, Sept. 2.—An important treaty, by the terms of which the United States secures control of the waters of the harbors of Colon and Ancon, together with certain other valuable rights, was signed here today by William J. Price, the American minister and secretary of foreign relations for Panama. The new convention has been under consideration for the past four years.

The United States acquires absolute control over all the waters of Colon and Ancon harbors, and in addition two small islands lying in Ancon harbor which are to be used for observation and light stations. One of these islands will be fortified. The site of Battery Hancock, on the Colon waterfront, is given to the United States, as also is the control of all piers at the north entrance of the canal, costing approximately \$21,500,000.

### LEGISLATURE HOLDS A WAR SESSION

St. Johns, Nfld., Sept. 2.—The war session of the legislature opened this afternoon. The governor's speech stated that the purpose of the session was to enact bills for creating and financing a regiment, ensuring public safety by providing a moratorium if necessary, also the regulation of the prices of foods. He promised a measure enabling the government to appoint a commission to investigate last winter's sealing disasters, for which no adequate authority previously existed and a measure requiring all sealing steamers to carry wireless equipment henceforth. In both houses the rules were suspended. The opposition approves of the government's measures and the session will likely close on Saturday.

**REMOVING THE WOUNDED**  
 London, Sept. 2.—A despatch to the Chronicle from Paris states that orders have been issued for the removal of all wounded from Paris to Rennes and Nantes.
