Montreal, April 23.—The insimuation is made in connection with many stories of hardships sent out from the Canadian North West last winter that it was a part of a plan of campaign on the part of representatives of southern railways in the United States to divert travel and immigration from the North West not only of Canada but of the United States to the Southern States.
