SEARCH PARTY ORGANIZED
The Provincial Government have organized and equipped a search party of ten men, who left yesterday morning for the Seville, in search of Clarence Wright who mysteriously disappeared in April last, when on his way from the drive, on which he was working to his home in Newcastle. No tidings of the missing man have since been heard.

It is a matter of regret that some action in this matter has not been previously taken. On two occasions The Union Advocate urged the immediate necessity of a search party being formed, but the usual apathy, which is prevalent in this community was again manifested. Now at this late date, action such as this paper advocated, is being taken. "Better late than never", but we are firmly of the opinion that had something being done, instead of the apathy displayed when we first suggested the advisability of action, much better results would have been obtained.

Sir Lomer Gouin May Retire From Leadership

Quebec, June 4.—The first semi-official announcement of the early withdrawal of Sir Lomer Gouin from the leadership of the government of the province of Quebec was made in an editorial published in the Quebec Telegraph, the official English organ of the Gouin government in the city of Quebec.

"Much as the fact will be deplored by all well-wishers of the province, it appears impossible to disbelieve any longer in the persistent rumors of Sir Lomer Gouin's very early retirement from the leadership of the government. It is pleasant to know, if public rumor is to be credited, for the Telegraph is not in the confidence of the premier, so far as his private affairs are concerned, that his future is not expected to be a thing altogether apart from the future welfare of his country. Report has it that he is to form part of the administration of a huge industry of Imperial-wide importance now in course of amalgamation, and may also interest himself in a project destined to still further add to western Canada's development and means of transportation."
