

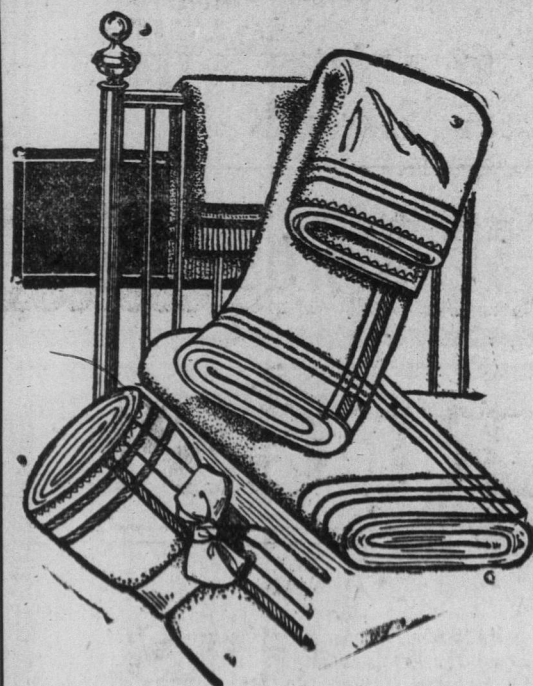

Hockey Season Opens.

Terra Novas Defeat Victorias by 6 Goals to 5.

The Hockey League began its fixtures last evening at the Prince's Rink where the Victorias and Terra Novas clashed in the presence of a large gathering of onlookers. His Excellency the Governor promised to attend but was prevented by engagement elsewhere. The ice conditions were ideal and in consequence players had not much difficulty in controlling the puck. The game was clean and though it could not be considered anything spectacular, it was nevertheless a hard fought contest. The sides faced off at 7:30, the personnel being:

Mr. H. A. Herdier refereed and Messrs. J. I. Vinnicombe and P. J. Grace acted as timekeepers.

FIRST PERIOD.

Immediately the puck was put in motion the Terra Novas started hostilities and rushed into the back division of their opponents' who equally prepared for the "criticized" and retaliated with a fierce attack, which, however, proved of little effect. Some lively play was then exhibited by both sides, each trying to gain an advantage. Assuming the aggressive the Terra Novas made several fine dashes but the Victorias put up a stubborn defence and managed to keep the danger zone clear. Ten minutes of play had expired and nothing of a brilliant nature occurred until Stick gave a splendid exhibition of stick-handling and drew first blood, besides scoring the first goal for the season.

This aroused the Victorias who showed up better, though only for a short period, while the Terra Novas worked hard to increase their score. Ford "forgot the law" and was penalized for two minutes. The attempts of the Vics. to equalize were futile and Stick acquitted himself the second time by beating Hunt. The Terra Novas had their opponents "on the run" and before another 30 sec. had elapsed Stick tripled his trick. With three goals in their favour matters looked as if the Terra Novas were going to have a "walk over," but the Victorias thought otherwise and after a clever bit of combination play notched up their first goal through Duggan. Nothing further of any account happened in this period and the teams crossed: Terra Novas, 3 goals; Victorias, 1 goal.

SECOND PERIOD.

On resumption the Vics. struck up a lively pace and confined play to their opponents' goal quarters. Ere long Brien secured an opening and registered the second goal for his team. Continuing their attack the Victorias got the equalizer in quick time through King. Encouraged by their success the Vics did not let up anything while their opponents appeared to be rattled and Coultas made a fine run and scored the 4th goal for the Vics., followed by Johnson evening up matters for the Terra Novas. The latter then seemed to get the best of it and Tobin beat Hunt. Brien sent in No. 5 but before the Timekeepers had time to change their minds Trappnell had passed all opponents. No other scoring was done and the game ended Terra Novas, 6 goals; Victorias, 5 goals.
