HAILS FOR WEIGHT OF 16,000

The s.s. Sable I., Capt. J. A. Farguhar, arrived from the sealfisher, of about 16,000 young harps. Capt. Farquhar's early arrival is due to the water. Ice conditions during the spring were very unfavorable. The eals were not large until late, when ound the patch did not contain more was stormy the early part of the voyage and made it almost impossible for the crew to work. The captain and crew are all enjoying the best of ealth, and no accidents are reported. The Sable I. left this port on March 11th, and that night ran into a heavy N.E. gale with frost and snow. The slob ice around kept the sea down. At 4 o'clock in the afternoon Tuesday the 12th, the Sable's position was 15 miles N.W. by W. from Cape Bonavista. The ice being very heavy that night and Wednesday very little progress was made. At midnight the wind veered to N.N.E. blowing strong with the temperature very low. Early at daybreak on the 15th some scattered hoods were seen and the course was changed to west. A small patch of harps was sighted and about 400 were killed and taken on board. On Saturday another small patch was struck and cleaned up and the ship entinued north That night the worst kind of a blizzard with a gale rom the west prevailed, the ship being forced to burn down for the night. On St. Patrick's day there was a heavy gale from the N.W. with snow and in company with the Thetis and Fogota the Sable I. remained stationary. A number of old seals were seen next day but none killed. On the 19th the crew killed about 400 harps and a small number of hoods. On the 20th about 200 old hoods were killed and taken on board, and in the evening about 900 harps were killed as well as 180 hoods. About noon the Sable I. got into a large patch of hoods in which most of the fleet were working and picked up 400 more before dark. Next day the crew took about 800 hoods when Capt. Farquhar steamed west and got into the whitecoats. The following morning the crew secured 4,300, the best days work for the spring. On Saturday the ship again going westward ran into a patch of harps sufficient to load, but owing to the Sunday killing law the crew could do no work, other ships were burnt down for the day. Sunday evening and night a heavy swell came in, breaking up the floe, and Monday norning when the crew went on the ice, the young seals were dipping. From daylight until 3 p.m. about 300 whitecoats were killed and taken on board when the ice opened up and it was dangerous and difficult for the men to work at night. Capt. Farquhar decided that the patch being pracing more seals seemed rather doubtful, bore up for St. John's. All the steamers except the Kite were in the Sable I's company when she left for this port All were well fished, the Fogota looked very deen. Capt. Farguhar believes most of the steamers will return by the end the week. The Telegram extends congratulations to Capt. Farqu-
