

There passed peacefully away at his nome at Carmanville on the 19th inst. well known citizen in the person of Philip Hicks. Born at Bonavista in the year 1845, he saw seventy-six years of the shifting scenes of life in Newfoundland. He was one of seven rothers who were the pioneers o Carmanville and carved out homes o rthemselves and families there true sailor and spent the greater part of his life as master of a vessel n carrying on the Labrador and Bank fisheries. He was a respected citizen unselfish and generous and was strong factor in shaping life at Carnanville in the early days. He wo sons and two daughters at Caranville, and one son at Grand Falls, esides a large circle of relatives and riends, to whom general sympathy


