
LENINE EXPLAINS.

MOSCOW, Nov. 15. Premier Lenine, addressing delegates to the Communist International yesterday, explained just why Russia, the head and front of the revolutionary system, has rejected Communist principles and restored to capitalistic ideas which he calls State capitalism. "We went too far." he said "and we found that the peasants and small bourgeoisie, that form the vast numerical majority of our country were against us. To retain our power we had to satisfy them." On world revolution, or a world Communist policy or the United Front of World Labor, he said nothing, nor did he touch International politics. He aimed to show his hearers, first, why Russia exchanged pure Communist for State Capitalism, and second, why the change was justified with the results and beyond doubt succeeded.




