Three-Cornered Fight in Victoria, but Liberal Will Probably Win Out

LIBERAL CONVENTION BEING HELD TODAY

Hon, A. G. McKay Made Good in Address at Edmonton on Monday

Edmonton, Alta, April 8.—Four Liberal meetings were held tonight in various parts of, the city. Hon. Al G. MacKay was not present, as he is assisting Liberal candidates in other parts of the province, but Senior Candidate C. W. Cross and other prominent Liberals were heard. Mr. MacKay's great speech on Menday night at the monster Liberal rally was one of the ablest heard here, and it is claimed that it won him hundreds of votes among people whom he had not been known to before.

Mr. A. Bramley Moore, late representative for Lloydminster, who is not a candidate in the present election but who is taking very lively interest in the campaign nevertheless, returned from the eastern boundary of the province today, after having been through Wainwright and Battle River constituencies. Mr. Moore declares that while there is a genuine fight going in that part of the province there is a genuine fight going in that part of the province there is no doubt that the government candidates will carry every seat east of the city. He left for St. Paul to take a hand in that constituency in behalf of P. E. Lessard.

Hon. J. R. Boyle is campaigning in the Pembina district and other outlying points. Last night he spoke at Civide on behalf of Gordon McDonald, the Liberal candidate for Pembina, where he received a great reception.

James H. Wood, Mayor of Athabasca Landing, was nominated at a Conservative convention last night to contest the riding at the forthcoming deferred election. The selection was quite unanimous.

Three-Cornered Fight in Victoria

A nomination, which is in the nature of a forlorn hope, was made at Lamont yesterday when R. A. Bennett, Canadian Northern agent in that town, was placed in the field by the Conservatives to contest Victoria, rid-Conservatives to contest Victoria, ricing against Frank A. Walker, M.P.P. Conservatives to contest Victoria, riding against Frank A. Walker, M.P.P.

This makes it a three-cornered fight in that constituency, but the Conservative candidate will get practically no support and is almost certain to lose his deposit, while Michael Gowda, who is running as an independent, is dependent for his support upon openationality. Walker's re-election is said by his friends to be a certainty. The Liberal convention for the district of St. Paul will probably be the last convention of the present campaign. It will be held in St. Paul at De Metis tomorrow afternoon at which it is expected that representatives of every polling subdivision in riding will be represented. Nomination will in all probability g oto sitting members. P. E. Lassard, although Lawrence Garneau, formerly of Athabasca Landing, is a likely runner-up. The Conservative opposition in the riding is not serious and whoever gets the Liberal nomination is practically certain of election. Lessard has been in the country districts and principally among American settlers ever since the house adjourned. Garneau's main strength as contestant for nomination lies in the village, where he has many friends and supporters.
