Chairman Davis Talks About the Commissioners' Row With the Council.

"What row is this which the Water Commissioners are raising with the City Council over funds?" asked an ADVERTISER representative who was detailed to see Chairman George C. Davis on the subject.

"We are not raising a row," he remarked.

"Well, why does the difference exist between Mayor Taylor, as their representative, and Commissioner Essery and yourself as commissioners?"

"Briefly the position is this. At the last session of the Ontario Legislature an act was passed authorizing the issuing of \$130,000 of waterworks debentures. The money obtained from the sale of these debentures are the act states, is to be applied for the extension of the mains in the city proper, and in the recently acquired territory of London South, and the procuring of new springs, and that the residue of money remaining is to be given over to the City Council. I may further mention that the same act which gave the power to issue these debentures also imposed certain duties upon us as water commissioners. We are thus by law compelled to lay mains in London South. Now the City Council had a bylaw prepared in accordance with the provisions of the above act, it was read a first, second and third time and signed by the Mayor. At a subsequent meeting of the Council a bylaw was introduced repealing the former one and substituting \$70,000 in lieu of the \$130,000. Thus the matter stands at present."

"How does the Council justify their action?"

"On this ground: That the Water Commissioners in 1889 asked for \$70,000."

"How does the Council justify their action?"
"On this ground: That the Water Commissioners in 1889 asked for \$70,000."
"Why will that amount not suffice?"
"It may not because the act which was passed subsequently imposed additional work on us, made it compulsory; and we are also contemplating the purchase of springs other than those included in the estimate of 1889; and in addition to this the work is of a more difficult character than was anticipated. All the land is to be procured by arbitration, and we shall do the work as economically as is consistent with efficiency. Bearthis in mind that the money must be provided for us to finish our task, and if the \$70,000 is insufficient we shall be compelled to take our revenue for the purpose. I think it would have been decidedly better if the Council had not rescinded the bylaw which was framed strictly in accordance with the act. We would have been responsible for every dollar expended by us, and the Council could do what they chose with the balance after accepting responsibility for the same."

In future years, at least for some years to come, little or nothing will have to be expended on capital account, so that the Council will have all the revenue after paying ordinary expenses." ing ordinary expenses.
