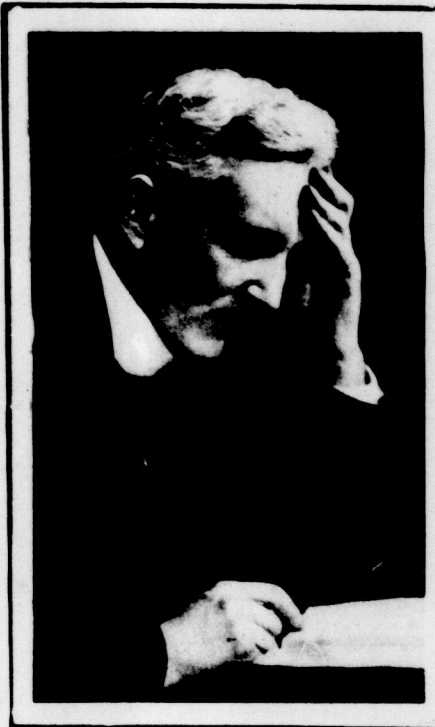




When London is fogbound. This is a mid-day picture (1.30 p.m.) taken near the Mansion House

Plaids on light backgrounds will be seen in abundance in the spring



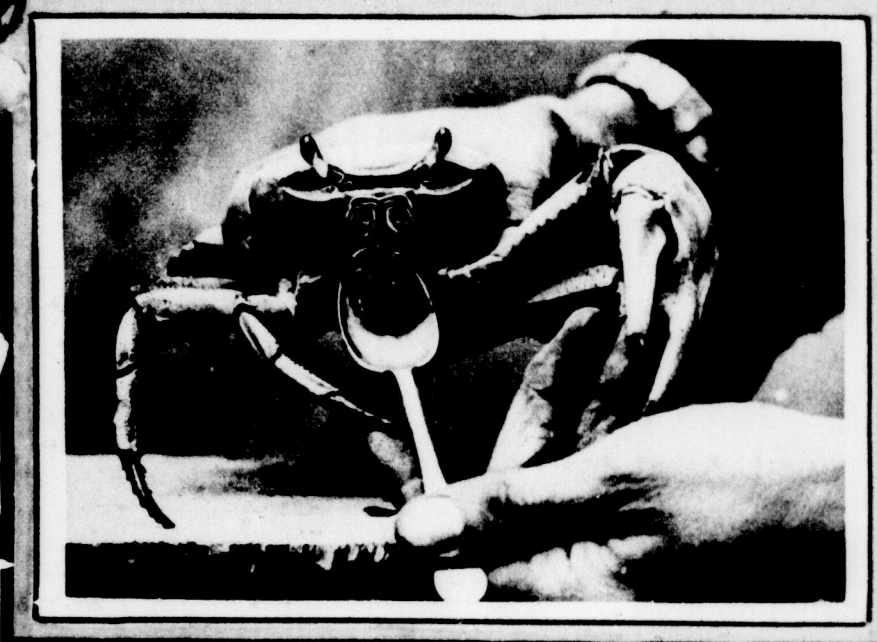

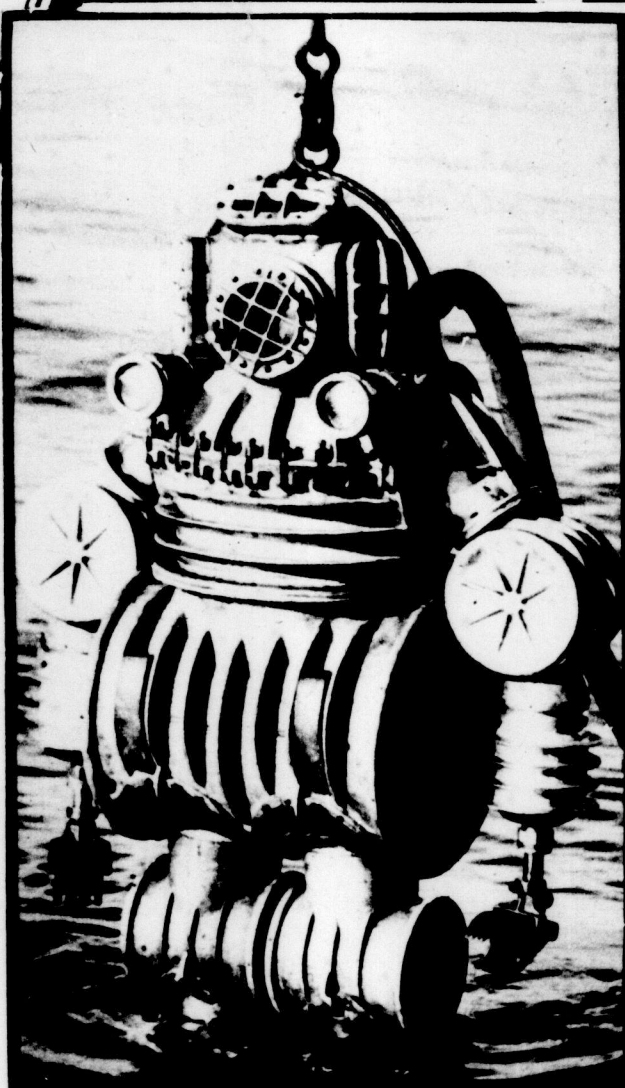

Bayin, outstanding star of the Siamese team, demonstrating their amazing national game, takraw, in vaudeville on this continent



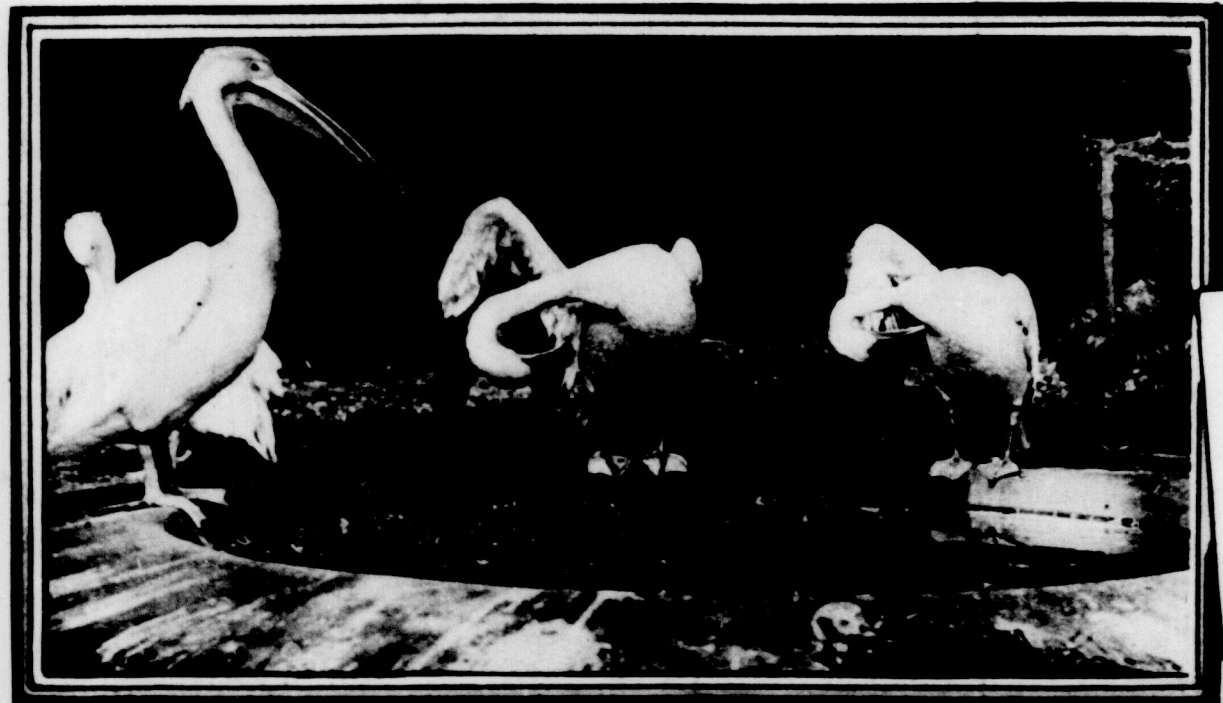
This land crab at the London, Eng., Zoo, receives tender care, being fed with a spoon
