BOULTBEE VS. ROLLS.

Divisional Court Allows, With Costs. the Appeal From Jadge Bole's Decision.

Reasons Given by Chief Justice Davie For Finding Against the Respondent.

The Divisional court, consisting of Chief Justice Davie and Mr. Justice Walkem have allowed the appeal in Boultbee v. Rolls. The following is the judgment of the Chief Justice :

The matter came before the County court upon an interpleader summons taken out by the sheriff, who had seized the goods under an execution for \$285 00 (debt and expenses) upon a judgment recovered by Boultbee against James F. Rolls, the grantor of the bill of sale in issue.

It was objected at the outset that the ap-All in good time, S. F., all in good time! peal was upon matter of fact only, and that no such appeal lies, as, by section 17 of the "County courts amendment act, 1893," appeals are limited to questions of law; but section 17 has apparently no force, as under section 8, section 17 comes into force only when proclaimed, and I cannot find that it has been proclaimed.

On the other hand it was urged by the respondent that there had been no proper service of the interpleader process upon the respondent, and that therefore the county court judge had no jurisdiction over him : but the county court judge was satisfied of the proof of service, and I am of opinion that his decision on this point is final.
