At the annual meeting of the stockholders of the Oxford Gold Mining Company, held recently in New York, the following officers were elected: President, Emerson Coleman; Vice-President, Edward Tuck; Secretary and Treasurer, F. F. Randolph.

Nov. 27th.—Mr. Randolph informs us that the company paid a dividend of \$100,000, 21 per cent. in 1887. Up to January 1st, 1888, the company had paid \$36,000 in dividends.

We find that the company has a quantity of quartz in the province that is well equipped with machinery for crushing and separating the gold from the gangue.
