Although we received the blue book containing the Public Accounts of Canada several weeks ago we have not had time to look over the contents until now.

The interest on the public debt amounted to \$7,066,841. The administration of justice cost \$709,784; Civil government, \$1,388,846; Legislation, \$302,187; Penitentiaries, \$300,830; Immigration, \$1,010,000; Postoffice, \$1,072,391; Militia, \$1,287,000; Public Works, \$1,072,001; Mail subsidies and S. S. subvention, \$206,115; Lighthouses and Coast Service, \$406,115; Indian, \$1,107,824; Post office, \$375,469. These constitute a portion of the payments made during the year.
