

ANNEX A

INDIVIDUAL TERMS REGARDING THE TRAINING OF BUNDESWEHR
UNITS IN CANADA

PART I—*General*

1. The training of Bundeswehr units shall be governed by the terms of Agreement Between The Parties To The North Atlantic Treaty Regarding The Status Of Their Forces (N.A.T.O. S.O.F.A.) dated June 19, 1951,⁽¹⁾ as implemented in Canada by the Visiting Forces Act. The term "Bundeswehr" where used in the agreement means the "force" and its "civilian component" as defined in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of paragraph 1 of Article 1 of N.A.T.O. S.O.F.A.
2. Canada shall exercise command and control over the training grounds and facilities used by the Bundeswehr at CFB SHILO. All applicable Canadian safety regulations shall be followed. The training shall be governed by the relevant German regulations.
3.
 - a. The Federal Republic of Germany shall bear the costs and expenditures of the training program of the Bundeswehr.
 - b. Subject to Article VIII of N.A.T.O. S.O.F.A., the Federal Republic of Germany shall pay to Canada all costs incurred by Canada as a direct result of the German Training Program.
 - c. The costs referred to in b. above include the costs for personnel, installations, material, equipment, supplies and services provided by the Canadian Forces or by other governmental or commercial agencies or sources at the request of the Federal Republic of Germany. With the exception of the construction service referred to in paragraph 18 hereto and the services provided by the Canadian Forces Logistic System, no administrative costs shall be charged.
 - d. Unless otherwise stated herein or in any other agreement between the contracting parties, the costs to be paid to Canada for lands, buildings and installations made available by Canada to the Federal Republic of Germany shall be only such costs as are incurred directly as a result of the construction, modification, operation and maintenance of buildings and installations.
4.
 - a. At the request of the Federal Republic of Germany, Canada shall arrange the procurement of material, equipment, supplies, services, installations and civil labour from private or commercial sources, all in accordance with the procedures, terms and conditions applicable to such procurement for the Canadian Forces.
 - b. In exceptional cases, the Bundeswehr may itself procure locally any supplies and services that it requires.
