Communications

Firan Corporation, Oakville, Ontario, supplied equipment as a sub-contract to Raytheon Corporation of the United States. During the emergency phase of the reconstruction, Raytheon had prime responsibility to restore Kuwait's airport communications systems.

Mitel Corporation, Kanata, Ontario, obtained orders for some 55 private branch exchanges (PBXs) for a number of hotels and government facilities in Kuwait.

DGB -- a subsidiary of SNC -- Montreal, Quebec, installed a spectrum management system in Kuwait in 1989. The company recently submitted a proposal to replace that system.

Miscellaneous

Canadian Airlines International Ltd., Calgary, is training pilots in Toronto for Kuwaiti Airway under a contract agreed this past summer. The contract also calls for Canadian to provide the Kuwaiti firm with a maintenance crew of 13 Canadians currently supplying engineering assistance over a six-month period on the Airbus A310-300.

McCain Foods, Florenceville, New Brunswick, is supplying frozen food products to Kuwait.

Chart Industries, Pickering, Ontario, supplied collision repair equipment to the Alghanim trading organization, agents and representatives for all General Motors products in Kuwait.

Western Star Trucks, Kelowna, British Columbia, received a contract in July for 47 oil field trucks to be delivered to an oil company in Kuwait by the end of January, 1992.

And Canedcom, Toronto, Ontario, has been contracted for a three-month period by the public authority for applied education and training in Kuwait. Eight Canadians are rewriting job descriptions, developing operational policies and procedures manuals, and restructuring teaching schedules and administrative programs for the Kuwaiti authority.
