Some Hon. Members: Agreed.

CUSTOMS ACT

MEASURE TO AMEND

Hon. Elmer M. MacKay (Minister of National Revenue) moved that Bill C-80, an Act to amend the Customs Act, be read the second time and, by unanimous consent, referred to Committee of the Whole.

He said: Mr. Speaker, I appreciate the opportunity to say a few words on this legislation. The purpose of this initiative is to enable the Government to improve working conditions in facilities at international bridges and tunnels with priority being given to Windsor, Ontario.

As Hon. Members know, these facilities have become outmoded over the years. Working conditions have deteriorated. It is necessary that the Government take action, if required, to improve working conditions and facilities to modern-day standards.

Mr. Jacques Guilbault (Saint-Jacques): Mr. Speaker, we on this side of the House welcome this Bill, especially in view of

the interest which has been shown by the City of Windsor to have it passed. My colleague, the Hon. Member for Windsor West (Mr. Gray), the Opposition House Leader, has been advocating and working for the advancement of this Bill. We hope the Bill will receive speedy passage through the House this afternoon.

Mr. Rod Murphy (Churchill): Mr. Speaker, on behalf of our caucus, and especially on behalf of the Members for Essex—Windsor (Mr. Langdon) and Windsor—Walkerville (Mr. McCurdy), I would like to express our desire to have this legislation passed. We think it is necessary, not only to protect the right of the City of Windsor to ownership of the tunnel in the future, but also to improve working conditions for the people working there at this time. Many of us have seen television programs showing the deplorable condition and what is happening at this time. It is important that we use the strength of the Canada Labour Code to make sure that there are safe working conditions. If the owners of the tunnel are not willing to do it, the Canadian Government should.
