

As every case assumed by the Fund involves a definite financial responsibility of \$100 it behoves the Fund's officials to convince themselves of the bone-fides of the applicant who may be any responsible citizen, but who must produce the military papers and identification therewith, of deceased, and make a Declaration under Affidavit before the properly authorised Court Official on a Form supplied by the Fund.

The Dominion Headquarters Executive of the Last Post Fund - all of whom, with the exception of the Organizing Secretary, are Honorary Officials - is composed of three Charter Trustees, and an Executive Council of fifteen members, eight of whom are elected from the Quebec Provincial Headquarters - the Parent Branch - and seven from the other provinces of the Dominion.

The Charter Trustees are Colonel (Rev) J.M. Almond C.B.E., C.M.G. Captain J.T. Walsh R.N.R. and Brig-Gen. C.J. Armstrong C.B., C.M.G.

The Executive Officers of the Council for 1923 are, General Sir Arthur Currie, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., L.L.D. President, Brig-Gen. A.E. Labelle 1st Vice President, Dr A.H. Abbott 2nd Vice President, and the Organizing Secretary-Treasurer, Arthur H.D. Hair.

The Members of the Council are, E.H. Scammell (Ontario) A.S. Clarson (Quebec) Pemberton Smith (Quebec) Lt-Col. C.B. Price D.S.O. (Quebec) Lt-Col. F.H. Osler (Manitoba) Howard Stutchbury (Alberta) Lt-Col. H. St J. Montizambert (British Columbia) Members yet to be appointed from Saskatchewan, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island.
