

(5) The Faculty will maintain traditional policies such as the following:-

- (a) That it recognize the importance of general knowledge and broad mental culture in all its candidates for higher degrees.
- (b) That the M.A. and M.Sc. degrees should be such as to indicate that the candidate has obtained a general knowledge of his subject, with some proficiency in independent scholarship or research.
- (c) That the Ph.D. degree be reserved only for those who demonstrate their capacity to perform original research, i.e., "make a contribution to knowledge", and at the same time show on examination a "specialist" knowledge of their subject, sufficient to qualify them, for example, to hold a university post.
- (d) That all final oral examinations for Ph.D. be attended by a quorum from the Faculty.
- (e) That external examiners be employed whenever possible to take part in reading theses, and in examinations in highly specialised fields of work.
