

is required to serve two purposes under the one set of conditions - (1) to lay the foundation for those intending to enter the professions; and (2) to produce scholars. Satisfactory work will probably not be done until there is some sort of a rough division between the two classes in the first two years, but not making the wall between the two so high that it cannot be scaled by either group at any stage.
