WITNESS: I submit that the question was if people from all the Protestant churches and other churches and the Catholic church felt that way about it, Hitler could never have started a war in the first place. It is impossible to imagine.

BY MR. BLACK:

Q. But we have to face the facts as they are. The war is on.

A. Yes.

BY MR. MCKINNON:

Q. What about Japan?

BY MR. BLACK:

Q. You have got to go back and take things as they are. I will admit that I am as much opposed to war as you are. I would much prefer peace to war. But when they bring war to our shores, we have to meet it, and you cannot conquer them by prayer. It is impossible. You have got to take weapons of war and defeat them, and then christianize
