But special Care must be taken that such a Stock be extended no further than to what may be necessary to carry on the Trade effectually: Then every Proprietor will feel the Profits that may arise, which will naturally encourage them to be watchful that the Trade be carry'd on agreeable to the Intention of the Legislature, and for the

common Good of all Parties interested.

For if this Trade is put into the Hands of an opulent Company, whose Stock on which the Profits of Trade is divided shall amount to Millions, then such Profits will be so insignificant to every Individual as not to be felt, which may prove a Temptation to those in the Direction to make the Africa: Coast a Receptacle for such as may be altogether untit for the Trust that may be reposed in them; and besides, the Competition will be too powerful for the separate Traders, which may, in Time, weary them out, and leave the whole Trade a Monopoly, to the Prejudice of the American Plantations, and consequently to the Trade and Navigation of this Kingdom.
