The Order for Evening Prayer,

(WHEREVER SUCH SERVICE MAY BE HELD.)

- I Let him that ministereth read with a loud Voice these Sentences of Scripture; and after them the Exhortation, Dearly beloved Brethren, &c.
- **R**EJOICE in the Lord, O ye righteous; for it becometh well the just to be thankful.

O let us magnify the Lord our God; and fall down before His footstool; for He is holy.

'The Lord hath done great things for us, whereof we rejoice.

The Hymn appointed to be used at Morning Prayer, instead of Venite exultemus, shall here also be used before the Proper Psalms:

O give thanks unto the Lord, &c.

¶ Proper Psalms, XXXIV. CXVI.

I First Lesson, 2 Samuel, XXIV. v. 15 to the end.

T O sing unto the Lord a new song, &c.

¶ Second Lesson, Romans XII.

I God be merciful unto us, and bless us, &c. &c.

 Then the Creed, &c. to the end of the Lord's Prayer.
Instead of the Collect for the Day, the Collect used in the Morning Prayer shall be read.

- ¶ Then the two Collects for Evening Prayer, &c., to the end of the Prayer for the Clergy and Pcople.
- ¶ Then the Proyer used in the Morning Service, Almighty God, our Father and Judge, &c, and the Proyer for this Church and Kingdom, O Gracious God, who art kind, &c., as in the Communion Service.
- Then shall follow the Prayer for all Conditions of Men, the General Thanksgiving, &c., to the end of the Evening Prayer.
