THE 250th ANNIVERSARY

Of the Foundation of the City.

On the 17th April last the Numismatic and Antiquarian Society of Montreal passed a resolution suggesting the celebration of the 250th Anniversary of the founding of Montreal, by the holding of an

in this city in the year 1892.
