ST. THOMAS MAN HED FOR BIGAMY

Common Law Wife Claims to Have Met Him in Railroad City.

Detroit, Aug. 23.—Wednesday morning as Warren E. Stoner, aged 25, a conductor on the Jefferson avenue line, here, was about to draw his pay, he was arrested by Detectives High and Larkins on a charge of bigamy, preferred by his common law wife.

The woman claimed to have met Stoner in St. Thomas, Ont., a number of years ago, and to have lived with him in Detroit. Two children were born, both now dead. The second child died two weeks ago.

Mrs. Stoner says her husband left her last April, saying he didn't intend paying the rent any longer. On July 20, she says, he married Miss Ethel James, aged 22, of 387 Fifth street, the ceremony being performed by Frank G. Gilchrist, an elder. In obtaining the marriage license Stoner swore that he never had been married before.

"I went to the other woman's house, but it didn't do any good," sobbed the first Mrs. Stoner.

When a reporter called at 387 Fifth street, Detroit, yesterday, the second Mrs. Stoner opened the door only a few inches and refused to discuss the matter.

Stoner had \$39 on his person when searched in the central police station. His first wife is being cared for by her sister at 21 Columbia street east.
