PERJURY IS CHARGED BY NOVA SCOTIA CO.

Court Hears Preliminary Evidence re Peterson Lake and Nova Scotia Ores.

The preliminary hearing of John Longdon, charged with perjury by the Nova Scotia Silver Mining Co., in connection with a declaration in regard to the assignment of ores mined on the leased Peterson Lake property, came off yesterday before Magistrate Kingsford.

The facts of the case are as follows: The Nova Scotia Silver Mining Co. has a lease on a section of the Peterson Lake holdings, by the terms of which a royalty of 25 per cent. of the gross values of all ores mined on the ground is to be paid to the Peterson Silver Cobalt Mining Company, Limited.

The trend of the declaration was that only a portion of the ore mined on the leased property had been credited to the Peterson Lake company, and that in particular the silver lead was not kept separate. The declaration also stated that the charges would be corroborated by the former superintendent and head ore shipper of the Nova Scotia mine.
