

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a a tamily, or any male over 18 years ole, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba. Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominiou Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or/sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within little garden plots, from one to ten acres nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-tmpt a quarter-section, alongside his homestead. Price \$2.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead parent) and cultivate fifty acres extrs.
