ing all utensils perfectly clean and disinfected, etc.; to observe the sick accurately in regard to the state of the secretions, pulse, breathing, skin, temperature, sleep, appetite, effect of diet, stimulants, and medicine; and the managing of convalescents.

The course will include a term in the infirmary ward under the charge of a competent hospital nurse, and lectures will be given at stated periods by the asylum staff. Examinations, chiefly on practical points, take place from time to time.

The pupils will be paid at the rate of ten dollars (\$10) per month during the first twelve months; twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) per month during the remainder of the course, and at the end of this, if a satisfactory examination is passed and the nurse decides to remain in the service of the hospital, an advance will be given. In addition, the pupils are entitled to uniform, board and washing.

They will be required to wear at all times, when on duty in the ward, the hospital uniform dress, etc.

When the course is completed, nurses who have been successful at the examinations will receive a diploma, certifying to their period of training, etc.
