THE M. R. A. FASHION SHOW

Fashion lovers from all corners of the city, and some from neighboring places, viewed with evident pleasure the spring exposition and parade of manikins at the M. R. A. Ltd. stores, today.

The promenade took place in the big costume department on the second floor, which was very artistically decorated in a color scheme of orchid and yellow and suitably arranged for the occasion.

A large space in the middle of the room was reserved for the promenade, and rows of chairs placed on the side allowed spectators a good opportunity to view the latest spring styles at their leisure.

Ten young women from the Loyalist Chapter of the I. O. D. E. and as many children, ranging in size from tots to girls of twelve to thirteen, charmingly displayed these latest modes, and spectators were enthusiastic over the variety and character of the stunning and practical garments shown.

Noticeable among the spring style points was the fuller skirt again making its appearance. This was especially attractive in afternoon frocks of very fine fabrics. Biquets were another appealing feature, and full hanging or boxy coats seemed to have a decided prominence.

Suits of various kinds were exhibited. One, fashioned of the navy blue gabardine had a short box coat with heavy border of white silk stitching. The skirt was very plain, but finished with a broad satin sash with fringed ends.

A very smart and practical street suit was developed in grey tweed. It was in Norfolk style, with stunning belt and big pockets.

Coats were mostly along wrappy lines, loose fitting and hanging gracefully. An attractive model in sand gabardine was in Russian blouse style. Back and sleeves were elaborately embroidered in brown and gold.

In afternoon frocks there was plenty of variety. A straight line navy georgette dress, heavily beaded in self color and fashioned with side panels of accordion pleating, proved to be a great favorite.

A black dinner dress with foundation of satin and overdress of fine spotted net edged with black sequins, was conspicuous for its modesty. This had a corsage bouquet of old rose velvet flowers.

A dashing evening frock was fashioned in a simple panne velvet. It was simple in line, ornamented only with bindings of narrow gold braid, and a French blue ostrich decoration at waist.

Children's clothes revealed that wanted touch that only specialists on children's clothes can bring about.

In afternoon frocks for a twelve-year-old girl was scalloped around the bottom and trimmed with narrow white frills. It was an Empire style and had touches of colored wool embroidery. A small girl was very sweet in a white regulation middie dress, with navy blue reefer and middy cap; and another tiny tot was enveloped in a pink tulle party frock, all frills and riot edges.

Hats were never more charming in shape or color effects. A particularly smart model had a double brim of navy millan and a soft draped crown of pearl grey tulle, terminating with a short sash at the side. A "fairy" hat was in the shape of a breadbasket.

It was a navy blue with underbrim and top facing of navy. Crown was made of tulle and top brim was beautifully hand embroidered.

A fine grey draped turban trimmed with rows of applied roses over the crown was effective; and a black dress hat with a broad georgette brim and fluffy edge of fringed cellophane, deserved the favorable comment heard.

Kiddies' hats were lovely as their frocks. For the most part they were close-fitting shapes, made of combinations of fine straws and ribbons and simply trimmed with youthful rosettes and streamers.

These are only a few of the many lovely garments and accessories displayed in the afternoon's exposition. Others were equally charming.
