STATE OF TRADE

Great Boom in Building and Activity in Various Lines

Stock Market Irregular on Jump in Money Rates—Highest Call Loans Since 1914—Lowest Demand Sterling Exchange in Forty Years

(Bradstreet's)

Active wholesale and retail trade, more so, indeed, than usual at the mid-summer period; increased activity and output in industry, but especially in iron and steel and in building lines, in which latter a great boom is on; new high levels of prices, especially for foods, following a rise in all prices in June, some shading of crop estimates, especially of wheat and oats, but marked improvement in corn and to a lesser degree in cotton; an irregular stock market, due to vagaries of call money, which has gone as high as 20 per cent, the highest in four years and a half, and the lowest prices for British demand sterling exchange in forty years, are the big outstanding features of the week's report. In wholesale and jobbing trade a few market notes that the turnover is not as large as a few weeks ago, but nearly all report that it is in excess of a year ago, with raw textiles, manufacturers thereof, wearing apparel of all kinds, shoes, leather, jewelry, automobiles and accessories, lumber, other building materials and building hardware showing most activity. Most textile centres report mills taxed to fill deliveries, and few signs of the usual summer dullness are visible. Retail trade is as good as ever, with light wearing apparel leading, and with shoes, jewelry and automobiles and accessories selling well. In the automobile trade, while deliveries of some moderate priced cars are reported improving, buyers of many other makes are reported on a virtual waiting list.

Among the big industries the feature is the steady enlargement of demand for iron and steel, both on a domestic account and for export, bar iron and steel, nuts and bolts, wire products and structural all doing well, though of course nothing like the feverish activity of a year ago is noted in the lines in which war demand was then so influential. Export demand for plates and for rails is reported larger, and builders' hardware manufacturers are reported buying raw materials. Unfilled steel orders as of July 31 show a gain of 600,000 tons, the first gain since last autumn. Pig iron furnaces are more active and prices are firmer. Coal shows more life, the output for the latest recorded week marking the best output in months. Coke is firmer in price also. Copper is up 1/4 cents on the week. In the building industry the boom is on in earnest, with expenditures for June three times those for June a year ago, and the half year record shows that 1919 is fast overhauling the high records of 1916. Lumber, brick, cement, structural iron, nails and paints are active at most markets, an exception noted being Chicago, where \$2,000 men of the building trade are out with demands for \$1 an hour. At most other cities the labor situation is at least no more excited, and at several strikes have ended and business has been resumed. The prices situation shows no lessening of strength. The general level of all prices advanced during June, and this week has seen another rise in the Weekly Food Index Number. Corn for summer delivery has reached \$2 at Chicago and spot corn in New York is well above that with oats in sympathy. Hogs have reached new high levels, \$22.80 at Chicago, and beef cattle are up \$1.25 to \$1.75. Cotton and print cloth struck new high levels this week, though neither are up to the high levels of a year ago. The crop situation is more irregular, as shown elsewhere on this page, but the prospect would be encouraging to consumers in any other year but this, when a veritable fever of high prices seems to accompany the reports of good to excellent conditions in most food crops.
