Committee of Major Leagues To Draft Schedule, Eliminating Extended Jumps

Pittsburgh, Penn., Jan. 25.—Elimination of long trips by the baseball clubs of the National and American Leagues is a patriotic measure to relieve the travel in as far as possible was agreed on by the schedule drafting committee of the two leagues, in session here, as decided, and it is not likely that the playing in cities where Sunday baseball is prohibited, will be permitted to make the long trip to western cities where Sunday games are allowed for a single game as in the past.

He says he has no right to any portion of this sum, nor has any player under similar circumstances. The writer continues: "Alexander points to the fact that he won many games for the Phillies and always did his best while a member of the Quaker team. This is quite true, but he was paid a good salary for doing just that little thing, and he would have been an ingrate if he had not done his best. His skill made possible the sale by the Philadelphia Club, but he was paid a large salary just because he possessed that skill. "Any deal made for the services of a player is a transaction only between the clubs involved. So long as the purchase
