

A.73. cont'd. Campbell and myself -- I might say sir at the present moment I don't remember just which one of us opened it but it was opened in our presence and four ten dollar bills were taken from it.

Q.74. What did you do then?

A.74. I took the envelope and the money in question and gave Mr. Campbell a receipt for same -- this is the receipt here sir. (Handing paper to the Court).

THE DEFENDING OFFICER OBJECTS TO THE ADMISSIBILITY OF THIS ENVELOPE ON THE SAME GROUNDS AS THE OBJECTION TO EXHIBITS "I" AND "J".

THE COURT DISALLOW THE SUBMISSION OF THE DEFENDING OFFICER AND PROCEED WITH THE TRIAL.

RECEIPT DATED DECEMBER 20TH, 1943, SIGNED BY LIEUT. MORRIS, IS EXAMINED BY THE COURT, MARKED EXHIBIT "K", SIGNED BY THE PRESIDENT AND ATTACHED TO THE PROCEEDINGS.

Q.75. Whose signature is on the foot of that receipt, Exhibit "K"?

A.75. That is my signature sir.

Q.76. Do you produce these three documents in evidence?

A.76. Yes sir. The money and documents concerned were then turned over to the Assistant Adjutant.
