ONE OF NEWFOUNDLAND'S HEROES.

Mr. and Mrs. William Belbin Country Rad, have received word from Lt.-Col. Nangle, Director of Graves, Registration and Enquiries for Newfoundland, London, through the Militia Dept., St. John's, that the body of their son, Private Herbert Belbin, had been taken from the cemetery in which he was originally buried at Dusseldorf and re-interred in the South Cemetery, Cologne, Rhineland, Germany.

The late Herbert Belbin enlisted as a private at the age of 18 and went overseas with the Royal Newfoundland Regiment in 1916.

At the Battle of Monchy, April 14th, he was captured and brought to a German prison where he lived for fifteen months.

Here he, with the other English prisoners, worked in a stone quarry where, while engaged at work, he was accidentally killed.

Hundreds of fellow-prisoners of all nationalities followed the soldier to the Lutheran Cemetery where he was laid to rest.

According to the information received recently, the body has been exhumed from the cemetery at Dusseldorf and re-interred in Rhineland, Germany.

It is a great consolation to the family to know that their loved one sleeps with the dead of the Allied armies who paid the "Supreme Sacrifice" for righteousness and freedom.
