TO CLEAN SILK GLOVES.

Do not try to clean silk gloves with gasoline, but wash them very carefully. White and black ones can be washed in soap suds, rinsed and dried, the white ones being dipped into bluing water to give them a clear white appearance. Tinted gloves should first be soaked in salt water to prevent the color from fading. If a few drops of lemon juice is added to the rinsing water, the tints will be revived. Silk gloves can be ironed though a piece of linen should be placed over the gloves when they are ironed and only a moderately warm iron should be used. Silk hose can be washed in exactly the same manner and ironed when perfectly dry
