KINGS COUNTY SUICIDE. Some time ago Wm. Thompson, of Rockville, Kings Co., lost a valuable item and contents by fire. The loss unbalanced his mind and for some time he had a suicidal mania. Last Thursday the unfortunate man left his house with the intention of going to Houlton, Maine. He came as far as St. John, as a ticket was issued at St. John last Friday for Vancouver. He returned from St. John Saturday and started for Cedar Camp, where his wife and family are living, a distance of twelve miles from Sussex. He drove as far as Rockville with Mark Dole and spent part of the evening at the latter's home. This was the last seen of him alive. A search was made and the body was found in a barn buried with hay. There were no marks of violence or evidence of a struggle. He is thought to have taken poison. Deceased was 42 years of age and leaves a wife and 12 children.
