Mathematics, and Modern Languages, shall have obtained the highest aggregate number of marks in two departments; and in the event of such scholarship not being taken at any Junior Matriculation examination it will be awarded to the candidate (if any) at the ensuing First year's examination who shall answer the same conditions. This scholarship is tenable in conjunction with any other scholarship or scholarships.

In awarding this scholarship the comparative value of the several departments and sub-departments is estimated according to the following schedule:

## POLITICAL SCIENCE.

THE BLAKE SCHOLARSHIPS, two of the value of \$75 each, and two of the value of \$50 each. The gift of the Chancellor of the University, Hon. Edward Blake. These scholarships are open for competition alike to students in Arts in the Honor department of Political Science, and to undergraduates in the Faculty of Law, taking the same examinations.

The Ramsay Scholarship in Political Economy, of the value of \$60. The gift of Mr. William Ramsay. This scholarship is open for competition to all graduates or undergraduates who have been placed in the First Class in one of the Economic subjects of the Fourth year in the honor department of Political Science (Third year in the Faculty of Law); but not more than two years must have elapsed since the competitor passed the examination above named. The award is made upon an essay, the subject of which shall be some question in Economics or Finance of interest to the commercial community in Canada, to be announced in May of each year, and the competition shall close on the 15th of August thereafter, by which date the essays must be sent to the Registrar.
