GRANT, *Hon.* ROBERT PATTERSON, *J.P.*

S. of the late Lewis Grant, Bookseller and Publisher, Inverness, Scot. B. there 12 April, 1814. Ed. at the Inverness Royal Academy. Came to Can. 1833. Went to N. S. 1835. M., 1840, Annie, dau. of the late James Carmichael, of New Glasgow. Was President of the Pictou Bank. Contested four elections in the Liberal interest, in only one of which was successful; on that occasion he was elected to the N. S. Assen. from the N.R. of Pictou, which seat he held from 1859 to 1863. Has always been a Liberal, but differed from his political friends on one question—the question of Confederation, which he favoured. Called to the Senate 2 Feb., 1877.—*Sea Bank, Pictou, N.S.*

GUEVREMENT, *Hon.* JEAN BAPTISTE. (*Saurel*.)

B at La Visitation, Isle du Pads, P.Q., 4 Sept., 1826. Ed. there. M., 2 May, 1848, Marie Anne Farelhus. Is a farmer. Sat for Richelieu in Can. Assen. from 1854 to g. e. 1857, when defeated. Represented Sorel in L. C., Can., from 1858 until the Union. An unsuccessful candidate for Richelieu in Quebec Assen. at g. e. 1867. Called to the Senate by Royal Proclamation, May, 1867. A Conservative.—*Sophie Street, Sorel, P.Q.*

HARDISTY, *Hon.* RICHARD.

Father and grandfather were Chief Factors in the Hudson's Bay Company's service B. in the Company's dist. North of Ottawa, 3 March, 1831. Ed. at St. John's Coll., Winnipeg.
