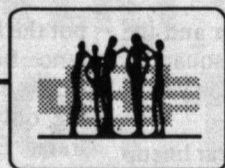

# Intramurals well underway

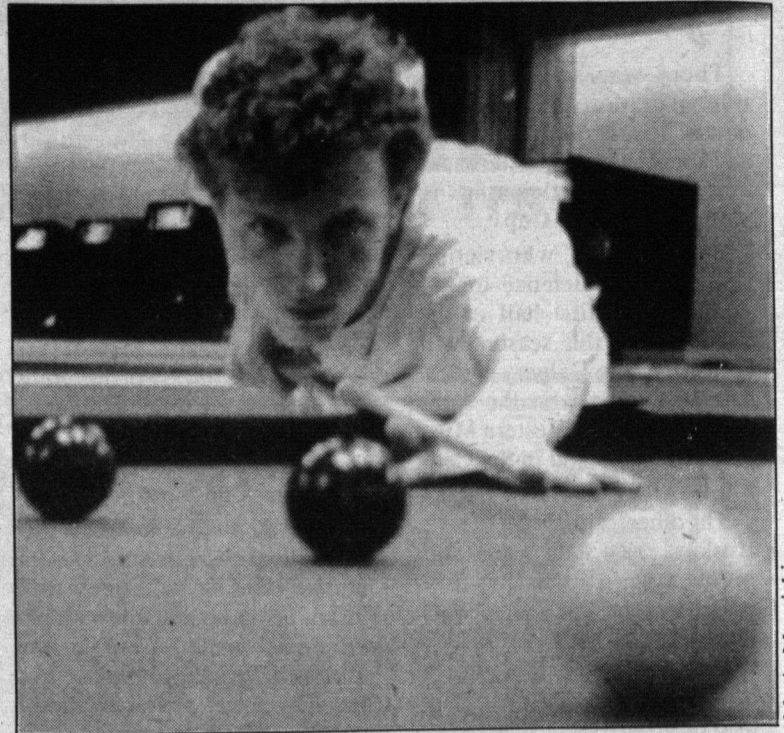

Did you know that 97 teams are playing in the hockey tournament currently underway, 33 teams participated in the outdoor soccer leagues, 107 individuals took part in the golf tournament, and the flag-football leagues had 44 teams participating? They are just a small part of the Men's Intramural Program (MIM).

The MIM point system is an indicator of the activities taking place. The system awards points to the various units participating in the MIM program, and is based on both participation and achievement in all activities. A unit is a group or faculty on campus that participates together throughout the whole program of activities. For each activity, each unit participating is awarded participation points and achievement points. The points are cumulative and statistics are calculated for each unit. At the end of the year, the total points accumulated by each unit are compared and champions are declared in three conferences, A, B, and C.

Conferences A, B, and C are designed to accommodate the variety of sizes of the various units. Each year, the top three finishers in Conference B and C move up, while the bottom three finishers in Conferences A and B move down. This allows for continual variety in the competition for unit standings.

13 consecutive years, until the unit was upset in 1985-86. Last year, the A conference was won by a very close-knit unit, St. Joe's. It was the first time they had won the championship.

The current unit standings have been calculated for the completed activities of golf, tennis, archery, turkey trot, tour de campus, soccer, and flag football. In the A Conference, good involvement in early activities is prevalent with Medicine, Law, Engineering, St. Joe's, Science, and Scope standing

neck in neck. At the end of the year, the winner of this conference will receive the University Athletic Board Trophy.

This year, a unique situation has developed concerning the A Conference. The Fairmaidens, a residence based unit composed of approximately 40-50 individuals, are the sentimental favorites to win the A Conference. If they are successful, it will mean three championships in a row for this unit as they won the C Conference in 86/87 and the B Conference in 87/88.
