

& persons would have been of
 thirty seven years of age, and would
 also, the Deputy Minister of Justice
 thinks, under the provisions upon
 to, have been entitled to share in the
 property of the Coughswage Indian.
 There is nothing, he also thinks,
 in the subsequent Statute to take
 away his right to to share unless
 such is the effect of the act of 1870,
 in which (Sec. 14 Sub. Sec. 2) we find
 the following provision:—

"The half breed who are by the
 "fathers side either wholly or partly
 of Indian blood now settled in the
 "Seigniory of Coughswage, and
 "who have inhabited the said sei-
 "gnory for the last twenty years, are
 "heretofore confirmed in their possession
 "and right of residence and property
