Agriculture; B.C. land reclamation projects;  
report of Cabinet Committee on Economic  
and Industrial Development

1. The Minister of Trade and Commerce reported that the Cabinet Committee on Economic and Industrial Development had had under consideration two projects for land reclamation in British Columbia.

The first was a recommendation from the Minister of Agriculture for deepening the Lillooet River channel involving authorization for a contract for this purpose in the amount of \$404,000.

The second was a recommendation from the Minister of Agriculture and the Minister of Veterans Affairs regarding irrigation facilities at Okanagan Lake, the object being to make land
