

years rendered efficient service as an educator to the City of Toronto. Mr. Lewis was born in England in 1813, and was for some years a teacher in Liverpool. Shortly after coming to Canada in 1855, he was appointed Principal of George Street School, being later promoted to Victoria Street and then to Dufferin. On account of advancing years, Mr. Lewis retired in 1888. He died in August, 1895.

The next Principal was Mr. Robert Willson Doan who comes of good old United Empire Loyalist stock. His ancestor, John Doane, sailed from Plymouth, England, in 1639 to make his home with the Pilgrim Fathers in New England, where he was associated with the immortal Miles Standish and John Alden in the Councils of the Puritan colony at Plymouth, Mass. In Canada, too, his forefathers took an active part in the great reform movements of the early part of the nineteenth century that won for Canada the magnificent system of self-government that
